CORE PRACTICUMS

These practicums are required, and are arranged in blocks of 2 to 5 weeks, except for Ambulatory Care, Practice Management, Staffing, and Free Clinic which are longitudinal for the duration of the residency. Additional focus (core extensions) can be chosen in certain core areas.

SELECTIVES

Thirteen weeks of additional practicum experiences may be chosen from the available selectives (range 1 - 4 weeks each): Critical Care, Surgery/OR Satellite, Oncology, Pain Management/Nutrition, Trauma, Neonatology, Comprehensive Medication Management (CMM).

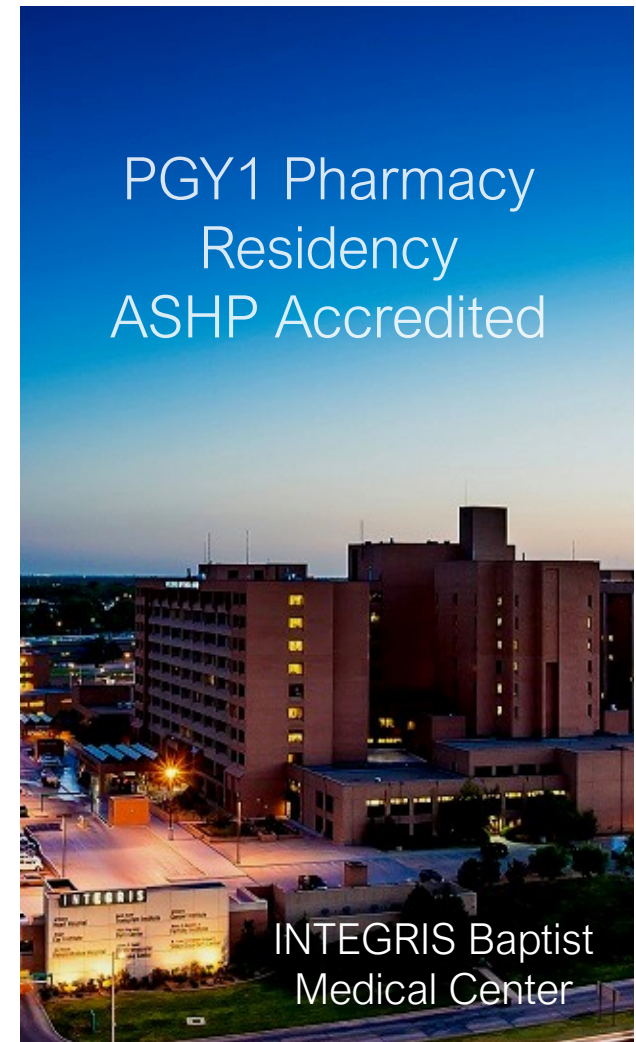

PHARMACY PGY1 RESIDENCY

Purpose of the residency: PGY1 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for post-graduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

At the completion of the PGY1 residency, the resident should demonstrate the following:

- Marketable skills
- Ability to work effectively on a team
- Proficiency in providing pharmaceutical care
- Positive professional attitude and leadership skills
- Commitment to continuous self-learning
- Effective communication and teaching
- Commitment to professional advocacy

The resident will provide staffing and pharmaceutical care support for INTEGRIS Health, but the institution supports the ideal that the residency fulfill the resident's professional goals by providing opportunity to master fundamental skills as well as experience a broad range of practice settings.

OBJECTIVES

The outcomes of the residency are achieved through the activities of the practicums using a subset of goals with accompanying objectives as defined by ASHP as Educational Outcomes for Pharmacy (PGY-1) Residencies. At completion, the resident is expected to demonstrate proficiency in the areas of medication use, medication therapy management, leadership and practice management, project management, education and training, and utilization of informatics.

PHARMACY PGY1 RESIDENCY

- All applicants must be graduates of an accredited pharmacy program in the United States and must be eligible for licensure in the state of Oklahoma within 2 months of beginning the residency.
- The primary goal is to prepare the resident for a career in pharmacy practice or for specialized residency or fellowship training.
- The residency is one year in duration.
- The residency structure can be tailored within broad guidelines and objectives to fit the individual needs of the applicant to focus on tertiary areas of interest in certain circumstances.
- The resident will support pharmacy services via staffing according to the expectations for full-time staff, subject to change based on needs of the pharmacy. Additional options for staffing are also available.
- The resident will be required to complete an original project, and present that project at an appropriate forum.
- Teaching opportunities for students in the professional pharmacy curriculum are available.

STIPEND & BENEFITS

- Required residency hours will provide an annual stipend of approximately \$51,000.
- Vacation and holiday time accrued each pay period.
- Eligible for full benefit package including health, dental, and vision insurance coverage.
- Flexible scheduling provided for interviewing needs and experiential opportunities.
